Ashland is located on Walhaven Drive in Franconia. It dates back to 1820 and was a hospital during the Civil War. You'll be able to enter this outstanding example of private restoration.



Sharon Chapel was built prior to the Civil War and then was burned by Union forces during the war. Ironically, it was rebuilt using wood from nearby Fort Lyon, a Union outpost.



Laure Grove School served Franconia's free African-American community for many years and comes alive during visitations.
